## South Korea hosts ICBA Conference October 2019

The Four Seasons Hotel, in Gwanghwamun, Seoul, South Korea is the venue for the October 2019 ICBA conference. The theme of the conference is 'Building on our Strengths.' The two-day packed agenda includes world class speakers that have travelled from countries as far afield as France, Spain, Germany, Italy, The Netherlands and The United Kingdom. 49 ICBA partners from 30 countries are expected to attend
